Scott Garceau

Part of the Baltimore sports landscape since 1980, Scott has been honored seven times as the State Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscaster and Sportswriters Association. The original voice of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens radio network, Scott and former Baltimore Colts legend Tom Matte broadcast the team's first 10 years, including Super Bowl XXXV win over the New York Giants. Scott is the former Sports Director at WMAR-2 TV and hosted the popular "Scott and Jeremy Show" on 1057 FM The Fan. Scott returned to the Orioles broadcast booth in 2020, providing play by play coverage of the home team, a role he previously filled for 13 years.

A member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, Scott is one of 48 individuals who meet over Super Bowl weekend to select the Hall of Fame inductees each year.



Jamie Costello

Baltimore native Jamie Costello grew up in Rosedale and joined WMAR2 News in May, 1987. Jamie currently co-anchors the 5, 6 and 11pm news on Channel 2 and is active in the community serving as emcee for various charities and organizations. He is a rabid Orioles and Ravens fan, and has participated in the Scholar Athlete Awards event for over 10 years.

Jamie has two grown children and currently lives in Annapolis with his wife, Cheryl, and their son Giovanni and dog CoCo.

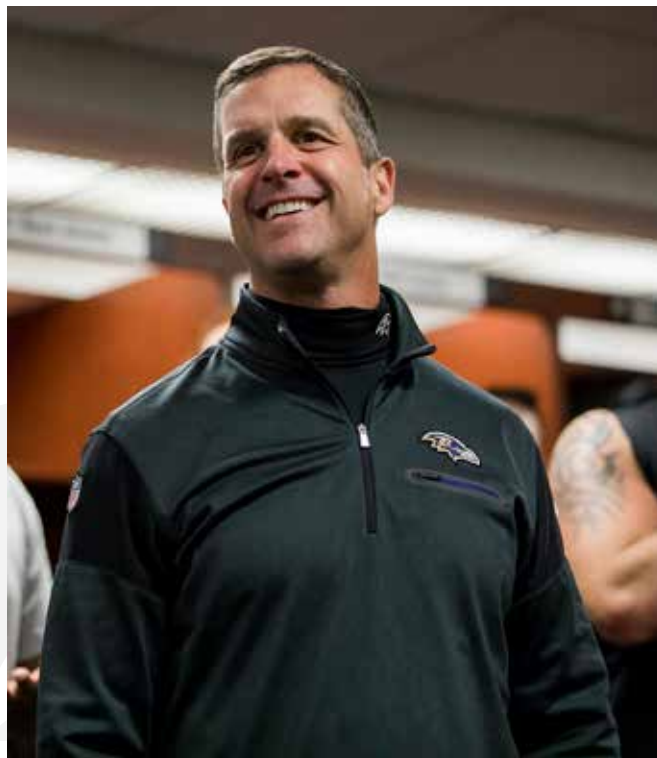
Special Guest Speaker

John Harbaugh Head Coach, Baltimore Ravens

Super Bowl-winning head coach John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in nine (2008-12 and 2014 & 2018-20) of his thirteen seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second World Championship. Impressively, Harbaugh is the *only* head coach in NFL history to win at least one playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career. Additionally, he owns the second-most playoff victories (10) by a head coach in the first seven seasons of a career since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.

Devoted to his family and his Christian faith, John is most active in helping the Baltimore area be better for families. He earned the 2011 "Power of Excellence Award" from the (Ben) Carson Scholars for "demonstrating excellence in life and being a role model." He's a board member for the Port Discovery Children's Museum and a significant contributor to All Pro Dads, along with numerous Baltimore-area events and charities.

Harbaugh has also been an advocate of the U.S. Military. The NFL awarded him its 2013 Salute to Service Award, acknowledging exceptional efforts by those in the league who honor and support military members. In 2012, Harbaugh also received the Outstanding Civilian Service Award. Harbaugh took part in the annual NFL-USO coaches' tour of the Middle East in 2009, has visited numerous military bases in the U.S. and abroad, has purchased school supplies for children whose parents are serving in the military and has sent care packages to troops overseas. In 2008, Harbaugh also helped institute Military Appreciation Day, an annual event that takes place during Ravens training camp. Since its establishment, an estimated 8,000 service members have enjoyed preferred seating and opportunities to meet with Ravens players and coaches each summer.



Harbaugh earned a degree in political science at Miami (OH), where he won the Football Scholar Athlete Award; he would later go on to earn his master's in physical education at Western Michigan. In April 2014, Harbaugh was inducted into Miami (OH) University's prestigious "Cradle of Coaches Association" and was immortalized with a statue on campus.

John, resides in Owings Mills, Maryland with his wife, Ingrid, and their daughter, Alison.

Special Guest Speaker

Rob Ambrose **Head Coach,** **Towson University Tigers**

Not many people have the passion for Towson University as head coach Rob Ambrose, entering his 12th season at the helm in 2020. A former player and assistant coach, Ambrose has used that passion to turn the Tigers into one of the top teams in the FCS. In his first 11 years as head coach, Ambrose led the Tigers to six winning seasons, two CAA championships, three playoff appearances and a trip to the 2013 FCS National Championship game.

Ambrose returned to Towson after spending seven years as an assistant coach at Connecticut, helping the Huskies from an FCS program into a major college contender. During his time in Storrs, Ambrose helped the Huskies to 49 victories, three bowl appearances and a share of the 2007 Big East championship.

Ambrose's coaching career began where his playing career ended as he joined the Tigers as a wide receivers coach in 1993 after spending the 1992 season as a student assistant. Under his guidance, wide receiver Mark Orlando earned All-America honors after catching 55 passes for 1,223 yards and 12 touchdowns. Ambrose took over as the offensive coordinator in 1997 and added the associate head coach title in 2000.

In his third season, Ambrose's offense led the country in passing yardage (381.2 ypg), while his 2000 team saw Noah Read lead the Patriot League in rushing.

As a player at Towson, Ambrose began his career as a quarterback before moving to wide receiver as a sophomore. As a junior, he caught four passes for 35 yards.



Three of those receptions went for touchdowns. An injury prior to his senior year forced him to the sidelines.

Ambrose graduated from Towson in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in English.

Coaching runs in the Ambrose family as Rob's father, Tim, was one of the most successful high school football coaches in Maryland. He won 249 games and 14 Monocacy Valley League championships in 31 years. Brother, Jared Ambrose joined the Towson staff in 2009 before taking over the offensive coordinator in 2013. Ambrose and his wife, Melissa, have two children: Grace and Riley.

2021 Scholar Athletes

6-0, 190, RB,DB

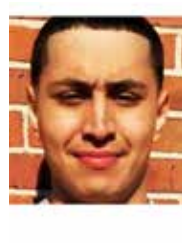



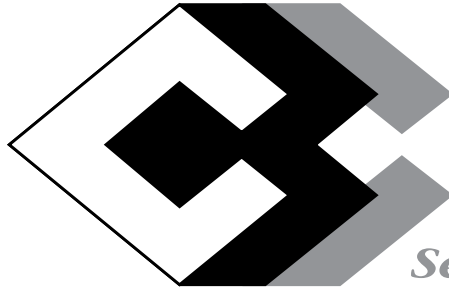
