Scott Garceau

Part of the Baltimore sports landscape since 1980, Scott has been honored seven times as the Maryland State Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscaster and Sportswriters Association. The original voice of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens radio network,

Scott and former Baltimore Colts legend Tom Matte broadcast the team's first 10 years, including Super Bowl XXXV win over the New York Giants. Scott is the former Sports Director at WMAR-2 TV and hosted the popular "Scott and Jeremy Show" on 1057 FM The Fan. Scott returned to the Orioles broadcast booth in 2020, providing play by play coverage of the home team, a role he previously filled for 13 years. As a long time member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, Scott is one of 48 individuals who meet over Super Bowl weekend to select the Hall of Fame inductees each year.

This past fall was inducted in the Maryland State Athletic Hall of Fame and presented with the John F. Steadman Lifetime Achievement Award.



Jamie Costello

Baltimore native Jamie Costello grew up in Rosedale and joined WMAR2 News in May, 1987. Jamie currently co-anchors the 5, 6 and 11pm news on Channel 2 and is active in the community serving as emcee for various charities and organizations. He


is a rabid Orioles and Ravens fan, and has participated in the Scholar Athlete Awards event for over 10 years.

THE BALTIMORE RAVENS ARE PROUD TO SUPPORT THE Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation

A. Paul Menton Award

The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the longtime sports editor for *The Baltimore Evening Sun*. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.



Archbishop Spalding

As the Baltimore area's top ranked team, the Archbishop Spalding Cavaliers capped a 10-2 season with an MIAA championship win over the McDonogh Eagles, 40-7. The Cavaliers have won 16 straight conference games, losing this year to Pennsylvania 6A state champs St. Joseph's Prep and 5A champions Imhotep Institute Charter High School. Spalding's defense allowed 10.6 ppg against conference opponents and averaged 26 ppg on offense. The team rushed for 1,930 yards on 339 carries and 28 TD's, while the passing attack garnered 2,260 yards and 22 TD's. The senior class at Spalding closed their careers with a 33-4 record over the last four years with 14 players slated to play college football next year.

The Cavaliers were led by University of Maryland bound All Metro Defensive Player of the Year Keyshawn Flowers and Offensive Player of the Year and Malik Washington. This was Washington's second year as the MIAA
Conference Player of
the Year. Senior Tyler
McVicker, junior Delmar
White joined Johnson on
the First Team All-Metro
defensive squad while senior

offensive lineman Jason Shipman, senior tight end Jameson Coffman and senior kicker Cooper Welch were named along with Washington to the first team offense. Senior running back Kaden Curtis and senior lineman Liam Lynch earned second All-Metro team honors in 2023. 18 players earned All County honors as recognized by the Capital Gazette.

Head Coach Kyle Schmitt completed his eleventh year at Spalding in 2023, raising his record to 78-33, and his fifteenth year as a head coach with a record of 116-42.

Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Awards

Numerous area public high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2023 football season. Five of the twelve teams in the Maryland State public school finals came from the Greater Baltimore Chapter and three chapter teams won state championship games at Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis, yielding 2A/1A, 3A and 4A/3A titles.

For these achievements, the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation will present Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Awards to these schools. The awards were renamed in 2008 to honor the memory of the legendary Dunbar High School coach who died suddenly prior to the 2007 season. Recognized by his peers and the community, Coach Eaton set a standard for performance and conduct that inspires coaches to embrace their roles as counselor, mentor, leader and friend.

Dunbar High School

In a driving and cold rain, the Dunbar
Poets won a record setting thirteenth state championship
with an 8-0 victory over
Calvert High School in
the 2A/1A state title game
at Navy Marine Corps
Stadium on December 1,
2023. The undefeated Poets
(11-0) won their third straight

title and beat the 12-2 Cavaliers. A scoreless first half was followed by the only score of the game in the third quarter, with Dunbar's Antonio Lyle breaking free for a 36-yard touchdown run on a fourth and 2 play that was followed by a 2-point Lyle run for the extra points. Weather conditions and staunch defensive plays on both sides of the line of scrimmage limited the two teams to less than 200 yards of total offense, including only 12 passing yards.

Dunbar was led by the All-Metro Baltimore area sack leader, junior defensive lineman Brian Collins, senior allpurpose back and All-Metro wide receiver Antonio Lyde, and All-Metro first teamer Maurice Cocolough, a senior offensive lineman.

Longtime assistant coach and defensive coordinator Michael Carter was appointed as the head coach in the fall and led the resilient Poets squad to one of its finest seasons in its long and storied history. Dunbar has a 37-game winning streak in place heading into 2024.

Mergenthaler Vo-Tech

For the second time in three years, the Mergenthaler Vo-Tech Mustangs captured the 4A/3A state championship on December 2, 2023 at Navy/Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis. The Mustangs (13-1) defeated last year's state champion, North Point High School



of Charles County, 14-7 capping a tumultuous three year term for the resilient team. North Point (13-1) had its 18-game winning streak snapped Saturday while Mervo allowed just two touchdowns in its five 4A/3A playoff matches.

Led by head coach Patrick Nixon, the Mustangs mantra was "Together" and the Mervo team showed it repeatedly, recording 9 shutouts and outscoring opponents 514-43. In the finals, Mervo came back from a 7-0 deficit to defeat the Eagles, who they scrimmaged in the pre-season to a scoreless tie. North Point scored its fewest point of the season in the championship game, and the 14 points Mervo scored were the most that the Eagles surrendered all year.

Senior Bobby Johnson scored two touchdowns, including a 31-yard reception late in the fourth quarter as Mervo defeated the previously undefeated Eagles. Junior Second Team All Metro defensive back Kasir Hicks helped to lead a stingy defense that allowed only 6 points in the prior 4 state playoff games while Coach Nixon ended his 12th season with a 104-39 record.

Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Awards, continued

Oakdale High School

The undefeated Oakdale Bears (14-0) beat Frederick County rival Linganore for the second time this past year to capture the Class 3A championship on December 2nd at Navy/ Marine Corps Stadium. The 42-35 victory earned Oakdale its second state championship, following a crushing loss in last year's state final game. Led by three D1-bound All-County performers, the Bears averaged over 41 points in their last 10 games of the season.

All-County Defensive Player of the Year Dom Nichols and Co-Offensive All-County Players of the Year Evan Austin and Hunter Thompson were a part of a team that boasted 3 other first team All-County selections and 6 second team All-County performers. Austin and Thompson accounted for 454 of the Bears' 501 yards of total offense in the final game, which scored on seven of their nine drives during the game.

Head Coach Kurt Stein completed his fourteenth year at the helm of the program, and earned the 2023 Baltimore Ravens Coach of the Year honors.



Special Recognition College Football Hall of Fame

Former Shepherd University football coach Monte Cater was inducted during the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner in Las Vegas on December 5, 2023 as one of four head coaches who joined 18 All-American first-team players in this year's class. Cater is the first person from Shepherd to enter the College Football Hall of Fame.


Monte Cater retired following the 2017 season as the nation's winningest active football coach across all NCAA levels, notching 275 victories in 37 seasons — six at Lakeland University (Wis.) and 31 at Shepherd — as he earned wins in more than 70 percent of his games.

Cater's teams made 13 postseason appearances (two in NAIA and 11 in NCAA Division II) during his career, and his teams appeared 16 times in the final national rankings. In 2015, he led Shepherd to the Division II championship game, finishing as the national runner-up. His teams claimed three Super Region One titles, and Shepherd led the nation in rushing defense each year from 2011-14.

Cater earned conference coach of the year honors 13 times during his career, won at least a share of 17 conference titles (13 in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, four in the Mountain East), and had the most victories and coaching titles in WVIAC history.

Cater posted winning records during each of his final 14 years with the Rams. He posted six undefeated regular seasons, including his last three from 2015-17, and his 245-93-1 record at Shepherd makes him the winningest coach in school history.

Cater has been inducted into the West Virginia Sports Hall of Fame (2020), the Shepherd Hall of Fame (2007) and the Millikin Athletics Hall of Fame (1999).



James Margraff Coaches Award



The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation created The James Margraff Coaches Award to honor Jim Margraff and his service as the longtime coach of the Johns Hopkins University Blue Jays and former Football Foundation board member.

Margraff, who was named as the Division III AFCA National Coach of the Year and the D3football. com National Coach of the Year in 2018, died suddenly on January 2, 2019 at age 58.

Margraff achieved a record of 221-89-3 over 29 years, making him the program's all-time leader. His 221 victories are the most by any college football coach in state history and ranked third among active Division III coaches. Margraff led the Blue Jays to the NCAA playoffs ten times, including the last nine years of his career.

Jim Magraff's legacy was shaped by his work as a coach and mentor of his players and staff. We believe his memory is best served by an award to a coach or assistant coach, be it college or high school in our chapter area who has distinguished himself and his team through the demonstration of the character and principles ("Pride and Poise") that shaped his career.



Chip Kelly

Chip Kelly, the newly appointed offensive coordinator at The Ohio State University, can trace his coaching roots to Baltimore and to the many relationships he's maintained over a thirty plus year career in football. Chip was recommended to Margraff by a mutual colleague, who was looking for a new defensive coordinator in 1993. Kelly came to Homewood for one season, but left an indelible imprint on the staff and players, exposing the traits that have earned him the reputation as an innovator, outside the box thinker and statistical analyst who changed the game well before others could grasp what he was doing. He developed a trademark reputation as the leader who was always willing to question the conventional and quick to ask 'why'. Margraff listened and watched Kelly's enthusiasm spill onto everyone, and as he remarked over the years, gave him the confidence to try things new and avoid the complacency that can invade a coaching philosophy that spans decades. Chip also invited Margraff to numerous training camps to renew their friendship, seek each other's input and share the joy that coaching brings to life. To this day, Chip has never forgotten the latitude that Margraff gave him to experiment, debate strategies and keep the game fun for his players.

Many know Chip's history of success at New Hampshire, Oregon, UCLA and at two NFL franchises, and may be a little surprised at his "step back" to the offensive coordinator position at OSU. However, the people closest to him, including his wife and new boss, Ryan Day, who served on Chip's prior staffs of four teams, have witnessed Chip's glee at the transition back to the daily coaching routine from the team CEO position, in one of the most turbulent times in college sports.

We are so fortunate that Chip has returned to Baltimore to be honored in the name of one of the people he has said is one of the great coaching minds in the sport and is willing to share his thoughts with our chapter members and guests.

Football has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George "Tank" McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter's first president, Howard "Dutch" Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. "Bo" Menton, Jr. Through the years, more than 3,775 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 55,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$545,000. Over 600 people will attend tonight's dinner where we will honor 77 outstanding young men. The budget for this year's affair exceeds \$50,000, in contrast to the original year's budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

The Chapter is also a supporter of the Baltimore Touchdown Club.

2024 Scholar Athletes

These scholar-athletes, representing football-playing high schools in the Baltimore metropolitan area, are selected by their respective schools primarily for their ability on the football field and in the classroom. Other factors taken into consideration include extracurricular activities, leadership, and community and church activities.

Every football-playing high school in Baltimore City and Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Harford, Howard, Carroll and Frederick Counties is invited to submit a nominee who best fits the aforementioned qualifications. The Chapter's selection committee, after careful consideration of each athlete's qualifications, will choose one individual from our five regions, who will each receive \$4,000 in scholarship support for his college education.
