## MILTON KENT, BALTIMORE SUN

Milton Kent has been writing about sports for *The Baltimore Sun* since 1988. ## JIM WEST, WBAL-AM

Jim West is a longtime Baltimorean who is the retired Sports Anchor for WBAL radio. He also fills in at times as a broadcaster when his service is required. He is a graduate of Baltimore Polytechnic and Towson University.

West started his career by announcing Baltimore Clippers hockey in the 1960's. He continued with the Chicago Blackhawks and Chicago Cubs and then with the Washington Capitals. His football play-by-play experience includes announcing for the University of Maryland from 1984 to 1986. From 1983 to 1989 West was half of the popular "Jones and West Morning Show."



## TED PATTERSON, WCBM 680 AM

A graduate of the University of Dayton, Ted came to Baltimore in 1973 as WBAL Radio's sports director, started its nightly sports call-in show and subsequently won the Maryland Broadcaster of the Year award three times. Ted moved to WBAL-TV in 1979 as its nightly sports anchor and moved to WPOC as its sports director in 1982. From 1983 to 1996, Ted was the voice of Navy Football, in addition to his duties as the Navy Basketball play-by-play man. Presently, Ted is the Sports Director for Talk Radio 680 WCBM as well as a part time reporter for Metro Broadcasting and ESPN Radio as a Ravens game day reporter.

An avid sports memorabilia collector and historian, Ted has written five books, including the most recently completed text, "Golden Voices of Football."

**F**ootball is an emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our free market, competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education process; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters throughout the country. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of Dr. George “Tank” McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter’s first president, Howard “Dutch” Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a young man from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard counties. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. “Bo” Menton, Jr. That year, 380 people attended the affair honoring 31 Scholar-Athletes. Through the years, more than 3,300 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 47,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$285,000. Over 1,200 people will attend tonight’s dinner where we will honor 94 outstanding young men. The budget for this year’s affair exceeds \$70,000, in contrast to the original year’s budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its Scholar-Athlete Dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar dinners held by Football Foundation chapters and is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete nominee from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter area.

Over the years, the Chapter has awarded more than 170 trophies to area high school and college football teams that have had significant achievements. In addition, the Service to Football Award is given in honor of Herb Armstrong, a founding chapter member and longtime president of the Maryland Scholastic Association. The Award is not an annual award, but rather is given to deserving individuals who have made a significant personal contribution and commitment to football in this area. Upon request, our Chapter assists area schools and colleges with advice and counsel concerning their football programs. The Chapter is also a participant and supporter of the National Play It Smart program, which is jointly sponsored by the National Football Foundation and the National Football League.

## PLAY IT SMART

In 1998, The National Football Foundation created PLAY IT SMART, an educational program targeted at kids from inner city environments where family and community support are generally lacking. The program, designed to take a student-athlete's passion for sport and intense dedication to their team and transform it into a force for greater good in their lives, has exceeded everybody's expectations. At less than a-dollar-a-day per student-athlete, the program has sent 87% of its participants onto college.

At the heart of the program is the PLAY IT SMART "Academic" Coach, equal parts mentor, advocate, counselor, teacher, coach and friend. Each academic coach receives special training and support from the National Football Foundation Center for Youth Development Through Sport (NFF Center) at Springfield (MA.) College, the only American college offering a graduate program in athletic counseling.

The Academic Coach works with the kids for the entire school year. It's the Academic Coach's job to turn each football team into a learning team, in the process lifting grades, SAT scores, graduation rates, community service participation and drug and alcohol awareness. He helps the players establish individual and team goals in key areas such as GPAs, SAT/ACT scores, graduation and college enrollment.

The program started in four schools in 1998, and with significant financial support from the U.S. Department of Education, the NFL and the NFL Players Association, has expanded to 128 high schools in 84 cities and 34 states with close to 11,000 student-athletes participating. Patterson High School was the first Baltimore area school to participate in the program and is still led by Academic Coach Kelley Bagdasarian. Edmondson Westside High School, led by Academic Coach Joyce Jenkins and Forest Park High School, led by Academic Coach Ayanna Malachi, were added as PLAY IT SMART schools over the past five years.

Each dollar makes an impact in the lives of PLAY IT SMART participants. In addition to the training and compensation of the Academic Coach, the \$25,000 cost per school covers everything from educational materials to SAT/ACT registration, parent programs, travel to area colleges and awards for outstanding achievement. Since its inception, the PLAY IT SMART program at Patterson High School has been fortunate to receive additional support from the Jonathan Ogden Foundation, established by Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Jonathan Ogden. Numerous sponsorship opportunities exist for those interested in supporting the program there and at other schools.

## A. Paul Menton Award



### River Hill High School

The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the long time sports editor for The Baltimore Evening Sun. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

This year's trophy goes to the River Hill Hawks. Head Coach Brian Van Deusen's squad captured its fifth straight Howard County championship, its third straight Region 3A championship and the school's first state title. Ranked #1 in the state by Maxpreps.com, the 14-0 Hawks outscored its opponents 551-21, recording 11 shutouts to tie the state record and allowing only 14 points in their first 13 games of the year. The Hawks offense averaged 387 yards per game, scoring 79 touchdowns, having three 1,000 plus yards running backs that led a rushing attack that racked up over 4,700 yards.

The Hawks were led by consensus senior All Metro and All State Linebacker Zach Martin and junior Defensive Back Michael Campanaro, both of which were leading rushers on offense for River Hill. Other Small School All State team members included DL Ryan Bounds, DB Leron Eaddy, RB Malek Redd, DL R.J. Murray and LB Jon Hill, most of which played both ways for most of the season.

Earning All Metro Coach of the Year honors from *The Baltimore Sun* and his third consecutive Howard County Coach of the Year award in 2007 and the Mideast Coach of the Year from the National Federation of High School Associations, Van Deusen has posted a 75-18 record during his eight years as the Hawks head coach. His 2007 staff included Til Campanaro, Lance Evans, Tom Gruneberg, Todd Martin, and Tyler Martin.



# Special Achievement Awards

## The Chris Schenkel Award: Johnny Holliday

In 2006, Johnny Holliday was named as the recipient of the National Football Foundation's Chris Schenkel Award, in recognition of his tenure of quality service and reporting on college football. In the past, Johnny's busy schedule has normally found him on this date at ACC basketball tournament. However, and it is our good fortune that the tournament does not start until next week, giving us the chance to thank him for his long and enthusiastic years of service to area sports by having him here tonight.

Since 1979, Johnny Holliday's distinctive voice has been synonymous with Terrapin football and basketball, serving as the school's play-by-play announcer for nearly 1,200 games as well as the host of the University of Maryland's coaches' shows. Considered the most versatile broadcaster in the Baltimore/Washington area, Johnny has announced eleven bowl games, five Olympics, the Washington Redskins, and the Masters. A 27-year veteran with ABC sports, his sports reports are heard mornings coast-to-coast on the ABC Radio Network.

A 2003 inductee into the Radio-Television Broadcasters Hall of Fame, Holliday penned a 2002 autobiography entitled "Johnny Holliday, from Rock to Jock," highlighting his transition from the nation's No. 1 Top 40 disc jockey in the 1960s to his current position as a renowned sports broadcaster. Holliday is also heavily involved in charity work, having raised over \$1.5 million for various causes, and he has had a flourishing acting career with more than 30 leading roles in Summer Stock productions.

Upon learning of his award in 2006, Johnny said "I am honored to be among the recipients of this very prestigious award; its namesake is one of America's truly great broadcasters... To be mentioned in the same breath with some of the past recipients of this award is humbling. My tenure with the University of Maryland has been the highlight of my broadcasting career and being associated with the sports teams and the great Terrapin fans has been an honor."



## The Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Award

Several area high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2007 football season. With two teams from our chapter area winning their state championship game (1A Dunbar, and 2A champions River Hill), and two others getting to the championship game (2A Eastern Tech and 3A Hereford) it proved to be a banner season for the Greater Baltimore region.

It was also a tragic season for one of those teams, with the sudden passing of Dunbar Head Football Coach Ben Eaton, Sr. on August 27, 2007. Coach Eaton represented the best in what coaches strive to be as a competitor, mentor, leader, coach and counselor, so much so that the Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation has decided to rename its Special Achievement Award to "The Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Award," in honor of his legacy.

### Dunbar High School

The Poets captured their second consecutive state championship and their fifth title in six tries since 1994 with a 58-34 win over Allegany High School at M&T Stadium. The 1A champion's win capped a 14-0 season for first year head coach Lawrence Smith, who was a lead assistant to Coach Eaton prior to his appointment. The Poets averaged a stunning 46.5 points per game during the playoffs, setting a state record for the tournament.

Ranked 2nd by The Baltimore Sun, The Poets squad was led by First Team All State and All Metro Player of the Year Running Back Tavon Austin, a junior standout performer who rushed for 2,553 yards and 32 touchdowns, closing the season as the state's career TD scorer and fifth on the career rushing yardage list with 5,287. The team also placed several players on the Small School All State team including first teamers OL Antonio Brown, WR Sean Farr, LB Tevin Brown, LB Keon Redhead, along with 2nd team DL Horace Miller, LB Kenyon Kinnard, and Honorable Mention players QB Jonathon Perry and All Purpose performer Davon Muse.

### River Hill High School

As noted above, Brian Van Deusen's Hawks also earned the Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Award with their hard fought 14-7 win over Baltimore County's Eastern Tech High School at M&T Bank Stadium in December. River Hill averaged 27.8 points per game in the state playoffs, with the only opponent playoff game scoring attributable to Eastern Tech.
