JIM WEST, WBAL-AM

Jim West is a longtime Baltimorean who is the retired Sports Anchor for WBAL radio. West started his career by announcing Baltimore Clippers hockey in the 1960's. He continued with the

Chicago Blackhawks and Chicago Cubs and then with the Washington Capitals. His football play-by-play experience includes announcing for the University of Maryland from 1984 to 1986. From 1983 to 1989 West was half of the popular "Jones and West Morning Show."

He is a graduate of Baltimore Polytechnic High School and Towson University.



TED PATTERSON, WCBM 680 AM

A graduate of the University of Dayton, Ted came to Baltimore in 1973 as WBAL Radio's sports director, started its nightly sports call-in show and subsequently won the Maryland Broadcaster of the Year

award three times. Ted moved to WBAL-TV in 1979 as its nightly sports anchor and moved to WPOC as its sports director in 1982. From 1983 to 1996, Ted was the voice of Navy Football, in addition to his duties as the Navy Basketball play-by-play man. Recently, Ted retired from his position as the Sports Director of WCBM 680 AM and contributing reporter for ESPN Radio and AM 1370 FOX radio, to spend more time with his children and traveling throughout the country.

An avid sports memorabilia collector and historian, Ted has written five books, including the most recently completed

ootball has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George "Tank" McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter's first president, Howard "Dutch" Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. "Bo" Menton, Jr. That year, 380 people attended the affair honoring 31 Scholar-Athletes. Through the years, more than 3,500 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 49,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$325,000. Over 1,200 people will attend tonight's dinner where we will honor 88 outstanding young men. The budget for this year's affair exceeds \$70,000, in contrast to the original year's budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its Scholar-Athlete Dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar dinners held by Foundation chapters throughout the country and the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its regional area.

Over the years, the Chapter has awarded more than 180 trophies to area high school and college football teams who have had significant achievement. The Service to Football Award is given in honor of Herb Armstrong, a founding chapter member and longtime president of the Maryland Scholastic Association. The Award is not an annual award, but rather is given to deserving individuals who have made a significant personal contribution and commitment to football in this area. Recipients include Herb Armstrong, Dave Kaufman, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Dutch Eyth, Charley Havens, Gardner Mallonee, Earl Banks, Ed Hargaden, Steve Hokuf, Ed Hurt, Bob Lumsden, Herb Ruby, Mason Russell, Dick Working, Mel Filler, Mitch Tullai, Jim Head, Reddy Finney, Ed Novak, Lloyd White, Toy Cragway, Augie Waibel, Joe Brune, Nick Schloeder, Andy Borland, Elmer Dize, Denny Cox, Bill Bauersfeld, Bob Patzwall and Doug DuVall.

Upon request, our Chapter aids area schools and colleges with advice and counsel concerning their football programs. The Chapter is also a participant and supporter of the National Play It Smart program, which is jointly sponsored by the National Football Foundation and the National Football League.

In 1998, The National Football Foundation created PLAY IT SMART, an educational program targeted at kids from inner city environments where family and community support are generally lacking. The program, designed to take a student-athlete's passion for sport and intense dedication to their team and transform it into a force for greater good in their lives, has exceeded everybody's expectations. At less than a-dollar-a-day per student-athlete, the program has sent 87% of its participants onto college.

The Six Play It Smart Measures of Success

- 1. Improve Grade Point Average
- 2. Increase Number of Students Taking the SAT/ACT & Improved Scores on Tests
- 3. Increase Graduation Rate & Opportunities for Higher Education
- 4. Enhance Life Skills Development
- 5. Increase Opportunities for Community Service
- 6. Increase Parental & Family Involvement

At the heart of the program is the PLAY IT SMART "Academic Coach", equal parts mentor, advocate, counselor, teacher, coach and friend. Each Academic Coach receives special training and support from experts in the field. Their training includes the national conference, which annually attracts dozens of the most knowledgeable speakers in the fields of sports psychology and youth development. Past speakers have included experts from Texas Tech University, the University of Alabama-Birmingham, the University of Georgia, the U.S. Naval Academy, the University of South Carolina, Springfield College, West Valley College, Texas Christian University, and the Indiana University at South Bend.

The Academic Coach works with the student athletes for the entire school year. It's the Academic Coach's job to turn each football team into a learning team, in the process lifting grades, SAT scores, graduation rates, community service participation and drug and alcohol awareness. The Academic Coach helps the players establish individual and team goals in key areas such as GPAs, SAT/ ACT scores, graduation and college enrollment.

The program started in four schools in 1998, and with significant financial support from the U.S. Department of Education, the NFL and the NFL Players Association. PLAY IT SMART has expanded to 128 high schools in 84 cities and 34 states with close to 11,000 student-athletes participating. Patterson High School was the first Baltimore area school to participate in the program; Forest Park and Edmondson High Schools have participated in the program over the past seven years.

Each dollar makes an impact in the lives of PLAY IT SMART participants. In addition to the training and compensation of the Academic Coach, the \$25,000 cost per school covers everything from educational materials to SAT/ACT registration, parent programs, travel to area colleges and awards for outstanding achievement. Since its inception, the PLAY IT SMART program at Patterson High School has been fortunate to receive additional support from the Jonathan Ogden Foundation, established by former Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Jonathan Ogden. Numerous sponsorship opportunities exist for those interested in supporting the program there and at other schools.



A. Paul Menton Award



Old Mill High School

The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the long time sports editor for The Baltimore Evening Sun. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

This year's trophy goes to the Old Mill Patriots. Head Coach Damian Ferragamo's squad won their first state 4A championship in the school's 35 year history, beating Wise High School of Prince George's County, 17-16 at M&T Bank Stadium in early December, finishing the season with a 12-2 record. Ranked #2 in the state by MaxPreps. The Patriots were lead by All State and The Sun's Co-Offensive Player of the Year Josh Furman, who rushed for 2,285 yards and 31 TD's. The University of Michigan bound running back rushed for 615 yards in the two games preceding the state finals, including a 442 yard effort on 42 carries against Arundel High School in a 58-55 playoff classic.

The Patriots also enjoyed huge contributions by RB Jason Clements, who rushed for 1,335 yards and 17 touchdowns, 2-way starter LB Randy Spann, senior DB A.J. Butler, QB Joe Thorton, and kicker Brad Cummings, who 46 of 51 PAT's in his first year of organized football.

Special Achievement Award

A Centennial Conference championship (its fifth of the last eight years) and a Quarterfinal appearance in the NCAA tournament allowed Johns Hopkins University to cap its most successful season ever and earn our special recognition tonight at the 47th Annual Scholar Athlete Dinner. With its most wins ever, the 10-3 Blue Jays finished the season ranked 8th in the country by the AFCA Division III Coaches Poll, 11th by d3football.com poll and in 2nd place in the Lambert Cup Poll, the ranking of the top teams in college football in the Eastern U.S. The 8th place ranking is the highest for a Centennial Conference team ever in the 11 years that the poll has been existed.

Coach Jim Margraff, in his 20th year at Hopkins now has 129 victories as head coach, making him one of only two Maryland coaches all time to win more than 125 games. Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Awards

Numerous area high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2009 football season. In what may be an unprecedented feat, state championships were won in all four state classes by teams from the Greater Baltimore Chapter region.

For these achievements, the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation will present the Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Awards to our four state championship schools. These awards were renamed in 2008 to honor the memory of now legendary coach Ben Eaton, Sr. of Dunbar High School, who died suddenly prior to the start of the 2007 football season. Recognized by his peers and the community at large, Coach Eaton set a standard coaches aspire to as a counselor, mentor, leader and friend.

Catoctin High School

The Cougars of Thurmont, Maryland returned to the state playoffs again this year to capture their first state championship in the school's history. The 37-12 win over Joppatowne High School of Harford County capped a 14-0 season, wherein the Cougars outscored their opponents 496-108. Long time Head Coach Doug Williams was recognized as one of two Maryland State High School Coaches of the Year, as recognized by the Maryland Football Media and ESPN.

Ranked 9th in the state by MaxPreps.com, the Cougars were led by All State performers DB Dylan May, DL Sean Reaver, WR Nick Nowaczyk, OL Brady Ridenour and OL Kyle Testerman.

Eastern Tech High School

The Mavericks from Baltimore County played in their third consecutive state championship game and came away with the program's first state title with a 16-8 win over Queen Anne's High School. Ranked #12 in the state by the MaxPreps.com, and led by the Baltimore Sun's and the ESPN/Maryland Football Media Coach of the Year Marc Mesaros, Eastern Tech won its final 10 games in 2009 on the way to a 13-1 record.

Eastern Tech had several players named to the All State squad, including DL Dan McManus, OL Don Guido, DL Emmanuel Gbor, OL Kyle Fratta, DB/QB Zach Burkhardt, All Purpose player Criszon Brown, DL Jake McNew, LB Alex Gibson and DB Chuky Iweh.

Linganore High School

The Lancers of Frederick County completed a record setting season, ranked #105 nationally and #1 in Maryland by Max-Preps.com, on its way to a 14-0 campaign. Its 31-14 win over Huntingtown High School of Calvert County was the school's 5th state championship in nine trips to the state tournament's final game, earning the Lancers recognition by the Frederick News Post as its "Program of the Decade."

Head Coach Rick Conner's team outscored its opponents 540-120 during the season, led by a host of superior performers. First Team All State members included Penn State bound Zach Zwinak, Wisconsin bound Rob Havenstein and Kicker Alex Eckard. The Second Team included OL Kyle Tucker and the Honorable Mention team included DB Ricky Conner, DB Nick Marth, LB Colby Weierbach, DL Anders Johnson, OL Kevin Saylor and RB Kevin Myers.
