

ootball has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George "Tank" McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter's first president, Howard "Dutch" Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. "Bo" Menton, Jr. That year, 380 people attended the affair honoring 31 Scholar-Athletes. Through the years, more than 3,600 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 51,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$345,000. Over 1,100 people will attend tonight's dinner where we will honor 89 outstanding young men. The budget for this year's affair exceeds \$75,000, in contrast to the original year's budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

Over the years, the Chapter has awarded more than 190 trophies to area high school and college football teams who have had significant achievement. The Service to Football Award is given in honor of Herb Armstrong, a founding chapter member and longtime president of the Maryland Scholastic Association. The Award is not an annual award, but rather is given to deserving individuals who have made a significant personal contribution and commitment to football in this area. Recipients include Herb Armstrong, Dave Kaufman, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Dutch Eyth, Charley Havens, Gardner Mallonee, Earl Banks, Ed Hargaden, Steve Hokuf, Ed Hurt, Bob Lumsden, Herb Ruby, Mason Russell, Dick Working, Mel Filler, Mitch Tullai, Jim Head, Reddy Finney, Ed Novak, Lloyd White, Toy Cragway, Augie Waibel, Joe Brune, Nick Schloeder, Andy Borland, Elmer Dize, Denny Cox, Bill Bauersfeld, Bob Patzwall and Doug DuVall.

Upon request, our Chapter aids area schools and colleges with advice and counsel concerning their football programs. The Chapter is also a supporter of the Johns Hopkins Heart Hype program, the Baltimore Touchdown Club, and the National Football League Retired Players Association.



A. Paul Menton Award



Calvert Hall College High School

The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the long time sports editor for The Baltimore Evening Sun. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

This year's trophy goes to the Calvert Hall College High School Cardinals. Head Coach Donald Davis, a 1996 Calvert Hall alumnus, led Calvert Hall to the MIAA "A" championship and completed the season 11-1, beating Loyola High School 41-13 in the annual Thanksgiving Turkey Bowl at M&T Bank Stadium.

Ranked #1 in the state by MDVaristy.com and The Baltimore Sun, the Cardinals were lead by The Sun's Defensive Player of the Year Dan Yarborough, First Team All Metro quarterback Thomas Stuart, OL Ben Curtis and DB Adrian Amos and Second Team DL Stefan Janik. Stuart threw for 1,978 yards and 15 touchdowns, while rushing for 5 other scores.

Coach Davis was fortunate to be assisted by coaches Chris Cook, Bob Corton, Dante Hagans, Ed Holshue, Skip Hartley, Cory Robinson, Phil Hines, Vernon Southwick, Mike Williams, Boh Hatter, FrankCurreri, and Adam Southwick during the 2010 sseason.

The Courage Award

For the second year, the Professional Athletes Foundation, through the local National Football League Former Players Chapter, is proud to partner with the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation to present The Courage Award to a student athlete that has excelled both on and off the playing field while overcoming personal hardship during their young playing careers.



Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Awards

Numerous area high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2010 football season. Greater Baltimore Chapter teams participated in all four state championship games at M&T Bank Stadium, capturing three of the titles, demonstrating a discernible high quality of competition and excellence in Maryland scholastic football teams.

For these achievements, the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation will present Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Awards to these three schools. The awards were renamed in 2008 to honor the memory of the legendary Dunbar High School coach who died suddenly prior to the 2007 season. Recognized by his peers and the community, Coach Eaton set a standard for performance and conduct that inspires coaches to embrace their roles as counselor, mentor, leader and friend.

Dunbar High School

The Dunbar Poets won their fifth championship in six years with a 22-12 victory over the Havre de Grace Warriors of Harford County, Md. in the 1A state title game at M&T Bank Stadium on Dec. 4. The 13-1 Poets came back from a 12-0 halftime deficit to capture the title from a determined Warrior squad.

The Poets were led by first team All –Metro free safety DeonTay McManus and Second Team All-Metro running back Epe Henriques, who ran for 115 yards and completed an 81 yard pass to Andre Davis for their first touchdown in the championship game.

Dunbar coach Lawrence Smith said it's the one and only goal that his team set out to accomplish on day one of summer training camp. "They wanted to sketch their names in the rich history of Dunbar football," Smith said, "And now they have their own special place in greatness."

Urbana High School

MDVarsity.com's second ranked Urbana High School Hawks won the fifth state title in program history in early December by beating Henry A. Wise High School, 6-0, in the Class 4A State championship game at M&T Bank Stadium. Jude Merkel scored the game's only points on a 17-yard touchdown pass from Junior Michael Spahr with 8:42 left in the third quarter. Urbana's defense posted its school-record ninth shutout and gave up just 41 points all season, while its first string defense surrendered only two touchdowns. First year coach Ryan Hines' Hawks finished with a 13-0 record, and never trailed an opponent during the 2010 season. Urbana has never lost a state championship game, having won its last title in 2001.

Wilde Lake High School

The Wilde Lake High School Wildecats stifled Franklin High School's running game, intercepted two passes and held off a late Indians surge en route to a 21-14 victory for the Class 3A state title at M&T Bank Stadium in early December. The Wildecats (11-3) finished off their fourth straight upset in the playoffs to win their sixth state crown and their first since 1997.

Khalil Viera, who ran for 121 yards on 19 carries, scored the game-winning touchdown on a double handoff from E.J. Gilman with 5:51 left in the third quarter. The Franklin Indians, who had won their past two playoff games in the final five seconds, rallied to within one touchdown with 2:18 to go, but the Wildecats recovered the onside kick and ran out the clock. The Wildecats only threw the ball three times against Franklin and rushed for 236 total yards to secure Baltimore Sun Coach of the Year Michael Harrison's first state championship.

In the regional playoffs, Wilde Lake avenged regularseason losses to local foes Atholton and River Hill then pulled off perhaps the biggest upset of the season over previously undefeated Damascus of Montgomery County, the No. 1 team in the state.
