SCOTT GARCEAU, 105.7 The Fan

Part of the Baltimore sports landscape since 1980, Scott has been honored seven times as State Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association.

The original voice of the NFL's Baltimore

Ravens radio network, Scott and former NFL star Tom Matte broadcast the teams first 10 years including Baltimore's Super Bowl XXXV win over the New York Giants. Scott was also part of Baltimore Orioles broadcasts for 13 years as pre-game host and play by play announcer.

Scott co-hosts an afternoon drive Sports talk show on CBS's 105.7 The Fan. The popular Scott Garceau Show can be heard Monday thru Friday afternoons from 3 to 6 on "The Fan."

A member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, he is one of 44 members that meet each year at the Super Bowl to select the Hall of Fame inductees.



JIM WEST, WBAL-AM

Jim West is a longtime Baltimorean who is the retired Sports Anchor for WBAL radio. West started his career by announcing Baltimore Clippers hockey in the 1960's. He continued with the Chicago Blackhawks and Chicago Cubs and then with the Wash-

ington Capitals. His football play-by-play experience includes announcing for the University of Maryland from 1984 to 1986. From 1983 to 1989 West was half of the popular "Jones and West Morning Show."

He is a graduate of Baltimore Polytechnic High School and Towson University.



TED PATTERSON, WCBM 680 AM

A graduate of the University of Dayton, Ted came to Baltimore in 1973 as WBAL Radio's sports director, started its nightly sports callin show and subsequently won the Maryland Broadcaster of the Year award three times.

Ted moved to WMAR-TV in 1979 as its nightly sports anchor and moved to WPOC as its sports director in 1982. From 1983 to 1996, Ted was the voice of Navy Football, in addition to his duties as the Navy Basketball play-by-play man. Recently, Ted retired from his position as the Sports Director of WCBM 680 AM and contributing reporter for ESPN Radio and AM 1370 FOX radio, to spend more time with his children and traveling throughout the country.

An avid sports memorabilia collector and historian, Ted has written five books, including the most recently completed text, "Golden Voices of Football."

ootball has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George "Tank" McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter's first president, Howard "Dutch" Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. "Bo" Menton, Jr. That year, 380 people attended the affair honoring 31 Scholar-Athletes. Through the years, more than 3,800 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 54,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$405,000. Over 900 people will attend tonight's dinner where we will honor 79 outstanding young men. The budget for this year's affair exceeds \$75,000, in contrast to the original year's budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

Over the years, the Chapter has awarded more than 220 trophies to area high school and college football teams who have had significant achievement. The Service to Football Award is given in honor of Herb Armstrong, a founding chapter member and longtime president of the Maryland Scholastic Association. The Award is not an annual award, but rather is given to deserving individuals who have made a significant personal contribution and commitment to football in this area. Recipients include Herb Armstrong, Dave Kaufman, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Dutch Eyth, Charley Havens, Gardner Mallonee, Earl Banks, Ed Hargaden, Steve Hokuf, Ed Hurt, Bob Lumsden, Herb Ruby, Mason Russell, Dick Working, Mel Filler, Mitch Tullai, Jim Head, Reddy Finney, Ed Novak, Lloyd White, Toy Cragway, Augie Waibel, Joe Brune, Nick Schloeder, Andy Borland, Elmer Dize, Denny Cox, Bill Bauersfeld, Bob Patzwall, Doug DuVall and Roger Wrenn.

Upon request, our Chapter aids area schools and colleges with advice and counsel concerning their football programs. The Chapter is also a supporter of the Johns Hopkins Heart Hype program, the Baltimore Touchdown Club, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the National Football League Retired Players Association.

A. Paul Menton Award



McDonogh Eagles


The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late Paul Menton, the long time sports editor for The Baltimore Evening Sun. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.


This year's trophy goes to the McDonogh Eagles. The 7-3 Eagles secured the MIAA Conference co-championship with an exciting 21-14 overtime win over arch rival Gilman School in their 99th annual meeting. This was McDonogh's second straight championship, winning the outright conference championship in 2013. This championship was McDonogh's fifth, last earning co-championships of the MIAA-A Conference in 2006 and 2001, along with a B Conference in 2000


Head Coach Dom D'Amico, in his 21st year at the helm of the McDonogh program, with a career winning record of 152-89. McDonogh was the *MaxPreps #3* ranked team in Maryland and the 150th ranked team in the country. The Eagles were led by All State and All Metro linebacker Wyatt Cook, first team All State and All Metro Sr. OL Ellis McKennie, All State and All Metro defensive back Eric Burrell and All Metro linebacker Connor Young and All Metro and second team All State defensive lineman Josh Richardson. Cook will be playing at Purdue in the fall, while McKennie will attend Maryland and Young will play for Navy.

Coach D'Amico's coaching staff included Matt Macmullan, Mike D'Amico, Spencer Folau, Darren Ford, Hakeem Sule, and Andrew Sellers.









Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Award

Numerous area high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2013 football season. Greater Baltimore Chapter teams participated in three state championship games at M&T Bank Stadium, capturing two of the titles, demonstrating a discernable high quality of competition and excellence in Maryland scholastic football teams.

For these achievements, the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation will present Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Awards to these three schools. The awards were renamed in 2008 to honor the memory of the legendary Dunbar High School coach who died suddenly prior to the 2007 season. Recognized by his peers and the community, Coach Eaton set a standard for performance and conduct that inspires coaches to embrace their roles as counselor, mentor, leader and friend.

Franklin High School

Franklin High School of Baltimore County won its second straight Class 3A Maryland state championship in December with a 35-21 win over Damascus High School. The Indians were the 5th ranked football team in Maryland with a 13-1 record and number 2 ranking in the Baltimore Sun poll. This was the third trip to the state finals in the last five years for Franklin and their fourth trip to the championship game in their school's history.

Franklin was led again this year by the All State and All Metro passing tandem of quarterback Jacques Adams and wide receiver Steven Smothers. West Virginia bound Adams passed for 1,539 yards and rushed for 919 yards in 2014, scoring 16 touchdowns. He also played free safety for the Indians. Smothers, a repeat All State and All Metro performer, is a junior two way performer who scored four touchdowns in the championship game. Smothers finished with 696 receiving yards on 36 receptions, 143 rushing yards on 15 carries, 1,440 all purpose yards and 22 touchdowns.

All State Offensive Player of the Year Patrick Allen, played offensive line and was a repeat All State and All Metro teams member. Allen will play football at the University of Georgia. The All State second team roster included running back Darius Hinton and defensive back Jordan Adams.

Head Coach Anthony Burgos completed his 12th year at Franklin in 2014, closing the year with a record of 92-40. The Indians varsity coaching staff includes Ryan Hain, Bret Hain, Mark Agent, Jeff Fuller, Trenton Hughes, Tim Miller and Joseph Vals. The JV staff includes Mike Bellew, Edward Lahay, Dwight Tilman, Rick Washington, and Nicholas Funk.

Jim Margraff

During his 25th year at the helm of the Johns Hopkins University football team, head coach Jim Margraff became the winningest college football coach in Maryland when his Blue Jays beat Ursinus College 42-14 on November 1. Margraff surpassed former Morgan State University head coach Eddie Hurt, who won 174 games during his 30 year tenure (1929-1959). Margraff's 2014 team completed the season 11-1 as the Blue Jays advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs, giving Margraff a career record of 178-83-3.

The 11 win season was a Hopkins football season record and allowed this year's senior class to complete their careers with a 41-5 record four consecutive Centennial Conference championships and four trips to the NCAA playoffs. Margraff was already the Centennial Conference's winningest coach, as Hopkins secured their sixth consecutive conference title and tenth in the last thirteen years. 12 of his players in 2014 secured All Centennial Conference honors, including Defensive Player of the Year honors for Michael Longo, while Margraff earned his third Coach of the Year honor in four years.

Hopkins finished the season ranked 10th in the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) poll, having spent the entire year in the Top 20. Hopkins has been ranked in the AFCA top 25 since the fall of 2011.

A 1982 Hopkins graduate, Margraff also was honored as the NCAA Division III Region 2 Coach of the Year in 2014, his second such honor in the last 4 years. During his time as a player at JHU, Margraff was a four year starter at quarterback, completing his career as the Hopkins statistical passing category leader in passes attempted, completed, yardage and passing touchdowns.




