Part of the Baltimore sports landscape since 1980, Scott has been honored seven times as State Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association.

The original voice of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens radio network, Scott and former NFL star Tom Matte broadcast the teams first 10 years including Baltimore's Super Bowl XXXV win over the New York Giants. Scott was also part of Baltimore Orioles broadcasts for 13 years as pre-game host and play by play announcer.

Scott co-hosts an afternoon drive Sports talk show on CBS's 105.7 The Fan. The popular Scott Garceau Show can be heard Monday thru Friday afternoons from 3 to 6 on "The Fan."

A member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, he is one of 44 members that meet each year at the Super Bowl to select the Hall of Fame inductees.



JIM WEST, WBAL-AM

Jim West is a longtime Baltimorean who is the retired Sports Anchor for WBAL radio. West started his career by announcing Baltimore Clippers hockey in the 1960's. He continued with the Chicago Blackhawks and Chicago Cubs and then with

the Washington Capitals. His football play-by-play experience includes announcing for the University of Maryland from 1984 to 1986. From 1983 to 1989 West was half of the popular "Jones and West Morning Show."

He is a graduate of Baltimore Polytechnic High School and Towson University.

ootball has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George "Tank" McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter's first president, Howard "Dutch" Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. "Bo" Menton, Jr. Through the years, more than 3,700 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 54,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$445,000. Over 800 people will attend tonight's dinner where we will honor 73 outstanding young men. The budget for this year's affair exceeds \$75,000, in contrast to the original year's budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

The Chapter is also a supporter of the Baltimore Touchdown Club, and the National Football League Retired Players Association.

A. Paul Menton Award



The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the long time sports editor for *The Baltimore Evening Sun*. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

This year's trophy goes to the St. Frances Academy Panthers. First year Head Coach Henry Russell, was the third ranked team in the Maryland *MaxPreps* poll, and the 10th ranked team in the *MaxPreps* national poll. The 10-2 Panthers won its first MIAA A Conference championship with a 6-0 conference record, capped by 34-20 win over the Mt. St. Joseph's School. The 2016 season also included wins over South Pointe HS, the top ranked team in South Carolina, and #8 ranked Bishop Sullivan from Virginia Beach.

The Panthers had 10 players sign Division I national letters of intent in January, and expect to send another 6 players to Division III football programs throughout the region. Second team All Metro DT B'ahmad Miller will be a Terrapin in the fall, All Metro TE Myles Wright will play at Towson University, and CB Caleb John will play for the United States Military Academy at West Point.

Six Panthers played in last fall's Crab Bowl, including All Metro Defensive Player of the Year Sam Thomas. The *Baltimore Sun* All Metro teams included Panther RB Gary Brightwell, WR Randy Fields, DB Jordan Swan, and second



team DE Eyabi Anoma. Brightwell rushed for over 1,700 yards and 18 TD's, averaging 7.3 yds/carry.

When Coach Russell and his staff arrived in March 2015, the team that was winless in the MIAA in 2015 (2 wins overall) had only 15 players on the roster. Recognizing the unique set of academic and life trials that many of his players face on a daily basis, Coach Russell and his staff facilitated the creation of a SAT prep course curriculum, set up summer school for many of the student athletes, held life skills programs for many of his players, and located four different practice fields throughout the city for the school that does not have a home field. As such, the football team's and overall athletic programs' success has provided a positive, rallying cause for the student body, giving the students hope and an opportunity to overcome many incredible challenges that few tonight could fathom or survive.

Coach Russell's coaching staff included former head coach Messay Hailemariam, Bill McGregor, Ben Eaton, Jim Poggi, David Payne, Rick Bowie, Stan White Chris Baucia, Jermaine Lewis, David Goodwin, Jarvis Thomas, Bill Rodgers, Sam Poggi, Josh Austin, Orlando Mayo, Shaun Woodland, Keith Kormanik, Joey Ehrmann, Josh Ward, Danaz Williams, Ryan Burbrink

Walkersville

Walkersville High School of Frederick County won its second Class 2A Maryland state championship in December with a 33-6 win over Elkton High School at Navy Marine Corps stadium. The Lions were the 10th ranked football team in Maryland with a 14-0 record. This was the second consecutive trip to the state finals and the school's second championship since 1987. In 2015, Walkersville lost a 21-20 heartbreaker to Patuxent HS, completing an 11-3 season with 505 points scored and 191 allowed.

In the 2016 championship game, Walkersville was led by Chad Gleason, their all-time leading rusher, who tallied 125 yards and three TD's in the win, as the Lions outscored Elkton 27-0 in the second half. Gleason finished the season with 1,233 yards and 23 TD's.

In 2016, the Lions defense recorded six shutouts, allowing only 51 points against them, where no team scored more than one touchdown in each game. On offense, the Lions scored 57 touchdowns, rushing for over 3,900 yards, while averaging 6.5 yards per carry.

Head Coach Joe Polce, a Walkersville HS alumnus, completed his 10th season at Walkersville in 2016, his 22nd year in coaching. He was selected as the Baltimore Ravens High School Coach of the Year in 2016, the first Frederick County coach selected since 2009. KELLY is pleased to sponsor

2017 Scholar Athletes

hese scholar-athletes, representing football-playing high schools in the Baltimore metropolitan area, are selected by their respective schools primarily for their ability on the football field and in the classroom. Other factors taken into consideration include extracurricular activities, leadership, and community and church activities.

Every football-playing high school in Baltimore City and Anne Arundel, Harford, Howard, Carroll and Frederick Counties is invited to submit a nominee who best fits the aforementioned qualifications. The Chapter's selection committee, after careful consideration of each athlete's qualifications, will choose one individual from our five regions, who will each receive \$4,000 in scholarship support for his college education.

The regions and the schools contained in each are:
