A member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, he is one of 44 members that meet each year at the Super Bowl to select the Hall of Fame inductees.




JAMIE COSTELLO, WMAR-TV

ootball has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George "Tank" McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter's first president, Howard "Dutch" Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. "Bo" Menton, Jr. Through the years, more than 3,700 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 54,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$465,000. Over 700 people will attend tonight's dinner where we will honor 65 outstanding young men. The budget for this year's affair exceeds \$75,000, in contrast to the original year's budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

The Chapter is also a supporter of the Baltimore Touchdown Club, and the National Football League Retired Players Association.

A. Paul Menton Award

The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the long time sports editor for *The Baltimore Evening Sun.* Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.



St. Frances Academy

This year's trophy goes to the St. Frances Academy Panthers, its second in a row. Second year Head Coach Henry Russell, led the top ranked team in the Maryland MaxPreps poll, and the 5th ranked team in the MaxPreps Xcellent 25 national poll.

The 13-0 Panthers won its second consecutive MIAA A Conference title with a 6-0 conference record, and won the A Conference championship game over The Gilman School, 44-7. The 2017 season was topped off by a 41-3 win over Bingham High School of South Jordan, Utah, in the GEICO State Championship Bowl Series game on December 23rd in Phoenix, Arizona.

The Panthers yielded 61 points over the course of the season, allowing only one opponent to score 10 points or more this season and posted six shutouts in 2017. The Panther offense scored 534 points, and rushing for over

3,000 yards. The Panthers were led by Baltimore Sun All
Metro Defensive Player of the Year and Alabama bound Eyabi Anoma, the 2nd ranked defensive

end in the ESPN Top 300.

The Sun's All Metro first team included Panther RB Joachim Bangda,



Dunbar High School

The Dunbar Poets won their tenth state championship with a 30-26 victory over Fort Hill in the 1A state title game at Navy Marine Corps Stadium on Dec. 1. The 12-1 Poets won their first state title since 2012, and beat a Fort Hill team that had won the four previous 1A state championships. Dunbar is 5-1 in playoff games against Fort Hill, who last beat Dunbar in 1997. Dunbar's win was the first state football title for a Baltimore-area team since Franklin won the 3A crown in 2013. The Poets won seven 1A titles between 2004 and 2012.



QB Jared Lewis, second team All-Metro selection, threw 3 TD passes of 63, 60 and 87 yards and tallied 252 passing yards in the game. Lewis threw for over 3,000 yards during the season. RB Andre Brandon scored on the first play from scrimmage, a 68 yard jaunt that was a significant part of the 429 yards that Dunbar gained that day.

The Poets were also led in 2017 by All Metro second team selections RB Alfonzo Graham and DL Dwayne Johnson, LB/RB Shaun Tolbert and DB/WR Doshon Davis.

Coach Lawrence Smith was the Ravens Coach of the Week in November, following his team's 42-18 win over Edmondson. Coach Smith secured his 100th career victory in 2016, all of which have been won at Dunbar. This was Smith's sixth state championship at Dunbar, which dates to 2007.

Linganore High School

Linganore High School of Frederick County won its sixth Class 3A state championship on November 30th with a thrilling 28-27 win over Milford Mill at Navy Marine Corps stadium. The Lancers rebounded from a 19-0 deficit and scored the winning touchdown with 14 seconds remaining with a 2 yard run by RB Davon Butler. Butler rushed for 188 yards on 30 carries in the game and scored 3 TDs.

The *MaxPreps* 15th ranked football team in Maryland rebound- ed from two tough mid-season losses to complete the year with 9 consecutive wins and a 12-2 record. Linganore scored 474 points last season while allowing 241, which included 3 shutouts. RB Davon Butler rushed for over 1,500 yards in 2017, and was joined on the offense by junior QB Ryan Leyn, WR Joey Felton, and OL Cody Redden. The defense was led by CMC All County LB Luke Freeman, CB Zack Willett and DL Josh Taylor. The Lancers last appeared in the state championship game in 2013.

Head Coach Rick Connor, in his 16th season at Linganore, earned his 150th career win in the semi-final win over Oxon Hill. The championship win this year was his third, his last title coming in 2009. Coach Conner was elected to the Maryland High School Coaches Hall of Fame in 2014.

2018 Scholar Athletes

hese scholar-athletes, representing football-playing high schools in the Baltimore metropolitan area, are selected by their respective schools primarily for their ability on the football field and in the classroom. Other factors taken into consideration include extracurricular activities, leadership, and community and church activities.

Every football-playing high school in Baltimore City and Anne Arundel, Harford, Howard, Carroll and Frederick Counties is invited to submit a nominee who best fits the aforementioned qualifications. The Chapter's selection committee, after careful consideration of each athlete's qualifications, will choose one individual from our five regions, who will each receive \$4,000 in scholarship support for his college education.
