Part of the Baltimore sports landscape since 1980, Scott has been honored seven times as State Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sports-writers Association.

The original voice of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens radio network, Scott and former NFL star Tom Matte broadcast the teams first 10 years including Baltimore's Super Bowl XXXV win over the New York Giants. Scott was also part of Baltimore Orioles broadcasts for 13 years as pre-game host and play by play announcer.

Scott co-hosts an afternoon drive Sports talk show on CBS's 105.7 The Fan. The popular Scott Garceau Show can be heard Monday thru Friday afternoons from 3 to 6 on "The Fan."

A member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, he is one of 44 members that meet each year at the Super Bowl to select the Hall of Fame inductees.

Football has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George “Tank” McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter’s first president, Howard “Dutch” Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. “Bo” Menton, Jr. Through the years, more than 3,775 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 55,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$485,000. Over 700 people will attend tonight’s dinner where we will honor 69 outstanding young men. The budget for this year’s affair exceeds \$75,000, in contrast to the original year’s budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

The Chapter is also a supporter of the Baltimore Touchdown Club, and the National Football League Retired Players Association.

A. Paul Menton Award

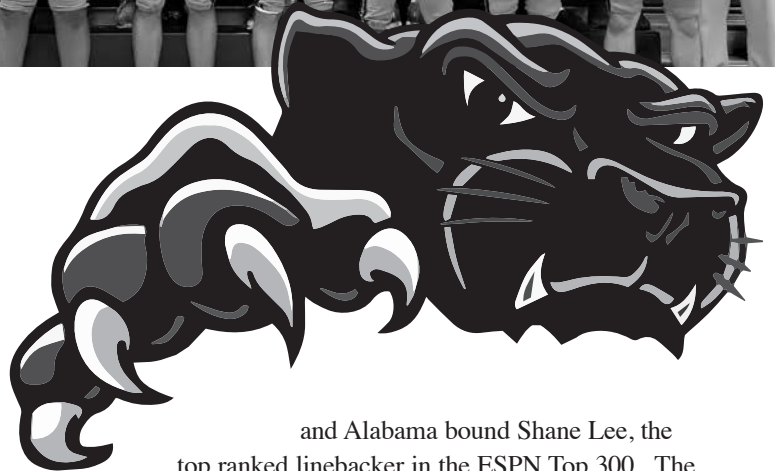
The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the longtime sports editor for *The Baltimore Evening Sun*. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.



St. Frances Academy

This year's trophy goes to the St. Frances Academy Panthers, its third award in a row. Third year Co-Head Coach Henry Russell, led the top ranked team in the Maryland MaxPreps poll, and the 5th ranked team in the MaxPreps national poll to a 10-0 record and its third consecutive MIAA A Conference title. The 2018 season was particularly challenging for the program as a summer notification of a need to cancel the conference schedule caused the Panthers to bring in over half of their opponents from outside of Baltimore and travel out of town for their remaining games. Regardless, the team scored 477 points, giving up 32 and concluded the season with a 43-14 win in the GEICO State Championship Bowl Series game on December 22nd over the Lee County High School Trojans of Leesburg, Georgia

The Panthers rushed for over 3,000 yards in 2018, and secured five shutouts, with no opponent scoring over six points during the regular season. The Panthers were led by Baltimore Sun All Metro Defensive Player of the Year



and Alabama bound Shane Lee, the top ranked linebacker in the ESPN Top 300. The Sun's All Metro first team included another Alabama commit in tonight's Panther Scholar Athlete nominee OL Damian Dalcourt, junior DE Chris Braswell, junior LB Osman Savage, senior K Jake Larson, and junior OL Mike Statham. Senior RB Jachim Bangda and junior WR Blake Corum earned 2nd All Metro team honors

Coach Russell's coaching staff included Biff Poggi, Messay Hailemariam, Bill McGregor, Ben Eaton, Jim Poggi, David Payne, Mike Williams, Stan White, Chris Baucia, Jermaine Lewis, David Goodwin, Sam Poggi, Josh Austin, Orlando Mayo, Shaun Woodland, Keith Kormanik, David Gore and Lamar Smith.

Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Awards

Numerous area public high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2018 football season. Nine of the sixteen teams in the Maryland State public school semifinals came from the Greater Baltimore Chapter and four chapter teams faced off in two of the four state championship games at Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis, yielding 2A and 3A titles.

For these achievements, the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation will present Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Awards to these schools. The awards were renamed in 2008 to honor the memory of the legendary Dunbar High School coach who died suddenly prior to the 2007 season. Recognized by his peers and the community, Coach Eaton set a standard for performance and conduct that inspires coaches to embrace their roles as counselor, mentor, leader and friend.

Oakdale High School

The Oakdale Bears of Frederick County won the Class 2A championship over Glenelg High School of Howard County 35-7 on December 2, 2018 at the Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis. The win marked the first state championship for the Bears in its 9th year of existence and 8th year of varsity play. The win capped a 13-0 season for the Bears, where no team got closer than 17 points during the season. Oakdale scored 546 points during the 2018 campaign, giving up only 95 points and ended the year ranked #7 in the Maryland state poll. Oakdale recorded four shutouts, and allowed only one team to score more than 14 points. Oakdale was the sixth Frederick County team to win a state title since 2009, while County schools garnered nine titles.

The Bears roster featured 26 seniors, led by Five Star kicker Justin Ritter, Kent State bound QB Colin Schlee, RB Simeone Sabvute, LB Ethan Martin, WR Noah Miller and WR Blake Baxter. Schlee threw for 3 TD's in the championship game, and ran for 89 yards, including a 66 yard TD jaunt. Oakdale's regular season included a 56-7 win over rival Linganore High School, a top 3A school that almost captured the 3A title.

When asked about the qualities that truly make this team special, Stein and his players didn't mention the individual performers that stood out in the regular season and playoffs. Instead, they all talked about the togetherness of the team. "We are the true definition of a family," senior Maurio Goings said. "We have a good time with each other. There is never a time where we are not smiling around each other. As soon as someone is down, we all help each other up."



Franklin High School

The Franklin High School Indians of Baltimore County beat Linganore High School of Frederick County 17-14 on a 29 yard field goal by All Metro kicker Simon Spath's as time expired on November 29th at the Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis. It was Linganore's second straight appearance in the final game, and capped a 12-2 season for the Lancers and Coach Rick Connor.

Franklin, led by the Baltimore Sun Coach of the Year, head coach Anthony Burgos closed a thunderous 12-2 season ranked #12 in the state and #5 in the Sunpaper's final poll. The win was the third state championship in six years for the Indians and their fifth appearance in the title game in nine years. "We had an interesting preseason but once we got to Week 1 and we got going, we kind of rallied around each other," Burgos said. "The guys were on a mission. That [preseason transfer] was kind of like the last straw. The guys were [angry]. They had to believe in themselves and I was saying we had a enough talent here and that's what matters. The way they came together, after a tough year last year, to form a family bond gave me the most pleasure."

Franklin ended the season with a seven game winning streak, having scored 455 points on offense while giving up 180. The Indians were led by All Metro first team performers DE Robert Garrett and 2nd team LB Jay Thompson and RB Elijah Solomon. Solomon rushed for 1,510 yards on 180 carries and scored 23 TD's, with eight 100 plus yards rushing games. Junior QB Vernon Brown III passed for 1,805 yards in 2018, with 18 TD's, connecting on 55% of his passes.

Burgos, in his 17th season with the Indians, was also the 2016 Coach of the Year, and has a 127-59 overall record at Franklin and is 75-15 over the past seven years. He has led the Indians to the playoffs 12 times.



Herb Armstrong Service to Football Award

The Service to Football Award is given in honor of Herb Armstrong, a founding chapter member and longtime president of the Maryland Scholastic Association. The Award is not an annual award, but rather is given to deserving individuals who have made a significant personal contribution and commitment to football in the Greater Baltimore area. Keith Mills

This year's recipient is Keith Mills, the long-time sports-caster and local personality who has graced the sports pages, television, internet and playing field sidelines for nearly four decades. A graduate of Brooklyn Park High School where he was multi-sport athlete, Keith later graduated from Towson State University with a degree in communications. Keith started his media career in the 1970's, working at the *Baltimore News American* under the tutelage of John Steadman, the Hall of Fame columnist and editor. In 1980, Keith started working for WJZ television as a producer, which led to his 1987 hiring at WMAR2 TV's weekend sports anchor, where he worked for 20 years. In 2006, Keith became a featured columnist for *Pressbox*, Stan Charles noted monthly sports tableau, where he wrote a popular column on Baltimore area high school sports. In his tenth year, Keith wrote his last column for the paper, as his broadcasting career took off again, becoming a featured sports personality who followed the Baltimore Ravens on WBAL TV and Radio, and its affiliated stations.

One of the treasured aspects of Keith's personality is that he keenly remembers so many individual athletes, coaches and community members, and can recall many riveting stories about the qualities, shining moments and lifetime lessons that sports have given him and those that mean so



much to the Baltimore community. For many years, he lit up the podium at the Scholar Athlete Dinner, calling on friends, coaches and athletes who filled us with the memories that exemplify the greatness of football and what it teaches us about life, hard work and comradery among teammates and adversaries.

For these facts and the courageous life he has led, we celebrate Keith tonight with our Herb Armstrong Service to Football Award.
