

Part of the Baltimore sports landscape since 1980, Scott has been honored seven times as the State Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscaster and Sports-

writers Association.

The original voice of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens radio network, Scott and former Baltimore Colts legend Tom Matte broadcast the team's first 10 years, including Super Bowl XXXV win over the New York Giants. Scott was also part of Baltimore Orioles broadcasts for 13 years as a pre-game host and play by play announcer. It was recently announced that Scott will rejoin the Orioles broadcast team in 2020 as the new play-by-play broadcaster and pregame and postgame host for Orioles broadcasts on MASN-TV. To accommodate the change, Scott is leaving his longtime afternoon slot as the co-host of "The Scott and Jeremy Show" on 1057 The Fan.

A member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, Scott is one of 44 individuals who meet over Super Bowl weekend to select the Hall of Fame inductees for the coming year.

ootball has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George "Tank" McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter's first president, Howard "Dutch" Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. "Bo" Menton, Jr. Through the years, more than 3,775 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 55,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$505,000. Over 900 people will attend tonight's dinner where we will honor 80 outstanding young men. The budget for this year's affair exceeds \$80,000, in contrast to the original year's budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

The Chapter is also a supporter of the Baltimore Touchdown Club, and the National Football League Retired Players Association.

Special Achievement Award

St. Frances Academy

The St. Frances Academy Panthers, led by co-head coaches Henry Russell and Biff Poggi, staked the Panthers to national prominence in 2019 with a #3 national ranking by MaxPreps and the number one position in the Maryland state football poll, earning special recognition by the Greater



Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation tonight. The 11-1 Panthers lost early in the season to Mater Dei of California 34-18, who at the time and for most of the season was the top ranked team in the country. St. Frances, whose program was started in 2008, traveled to four states over the course of the season to play its opponents, securing six shutouts while scoring 489 points and yielding only 74. The three-year record of the Panthers is 34-1, having gone undefeated in 2017 and 2018.

St. Frances was led by seven players who were listed on the ESPN Top 300 roster, including Alabama bound Chris Braswell, Michigan Wolverine commits Blake Corum and Osman Savage, Tennessee bound Dominic Bailey, LSU's Jordan Toles, Oregon's Luke Hill and Ole Miss bound Demon Clowney. In all, twenty (20) student athletes from St. Frances received Division I or Division II scholarships, several of whom have already matriculated at their schools.

Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Awards

Numerous area public high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2019 football season. Eight of the sixteen teams in the Maryland State public school semifinals came from the Greater Baltimore Chapter and four chapter teams faced off in three of the four state championship games at Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis, yielding 1A and 2A titles.

For these achievements, the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation will present Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Awards to these schools. The awards were renamed in 2008 to honor the memory of the legendary Dunbar High School coach who died suddenly prior to the 2007 season. Recognized by his peers and the community, Coach Eaton set a standard for performance and conduct that inspires coaches to embrace their roles as counselor, mentor, leader and friend.

Catoctin High School

Catoctin High School of
Frederick County won
its second Class 1A
Maryland state championship in its history
in December with a
31-8 win over perennial
champion Dunbar High
School of Baltimore. Running
back Carson Sickeri ran for 207

yards and one touchdown while junior quarterback Ryan Orr threw for two touchdowns to senior Travis Fields in the championship tilt at Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis. The Cougars forced six turnovers in the game, and scored a defensive touchdown to cap the dream season. Sickeri also set a single season Frederick County record with 41 touchdowns and rushing yardage of 2,352. Orr threw for over 2,000 yards and 20 touchdown in 2019, while Fields tallied over 1,000 yards receiving and 12 touchdown catches.

Catoctin was led head coach Doug Williams, who finished his 29th year at the Thurmont school, and also mentored the Cougars in their 2009 championship. In 2019 Catoctin racked up 572 points, while giving up only 187. Catoctin scored over 40 points in 12 of their 14 games, with the 31 first half points in the championship game being their lowest tally of the year. Catoctin held opponents to less than 21 points in 9 of its last 13 games, and yielded only 8 points in its last two games. The Cougars were the 22nd ranked team in Maryland in 2019 with a 13-1 record.

Middletown High School

The Middletown High School Knights of Frederick County won the Class 2A Maryland state championship with a 34-15 win over the Potomac High School Wolverines of Oxon Hill on December 7th at the Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis. The championship was Middletown's fourth state title, the last one coming in 2013. Head Coach Collin DeLauter led the Knights to a #14 ranking in Maryland with a 12-2 record, his third campaign at the helm of the storied program.



Quarterback Reese Poffenbarger led the Knights in the championship game with four touchdown passes to four different receivers, and staked the Knights to a 20-0 lead in the second quarter of the game.

Poffenbarger passed for 2,943 yards and 32 touchdowns while rushing for 449 yards, and throwing only 6 interceptions. Receivers Brian Walker and Matthew Mancini combined for 105 receptions, 22 TD's and 1,564 yards. Kadin Fisher led all Knight rushers with 817 yards, 11 TD's and a 6.1 yard average per carry.

The Middletown defense grabbed 30 interceptions, 23 sacks and 13 fumbles while yielding only 190 points and securing two shutouts. The Knights completed the year with an 11 game winning streak after a 1-2 start.

James Margraff Coaches Award



The greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation has created The James Margraff Coaches Award to honor Jim Margraff and his service as the longtime coach of the Johns Hopkins University Blue Jays and former Football Foundation board member.

Margraff, who was named as the Division III AFCA National Coach of the Year and the D3football.com National Coach of the Year in the fall of 2018, died suddenly on January 2, 2019 at age 58.

Margraff owned a record of 221-89-3 over 29 years, making him the program's all-time leader in wins. His 221 victories are the most by any college football coach in state history and ranked third among active Division III coaches. Margraff led the Blue Jays to the NCAA playoffs ten times, including the last nine years of his career.

Jim Magraff's legacy was shaped by his work as a coach and mentor of his players and staff. We believe his memory is best served by an award to a coach or assistant coach, be it college or high school in our chapter area who has distinguished himself and his team through the demonstration of the character and principles ("Pride and Poise") that shaped his career.



Rich Holzer, Mt. St. Joseph's High School

Rich Holzer, Mt. St. Joseph's High School's head coach, led the Gaels to the MIAA A conference championship in 2019, capped by a 17-10 win over previously undefeated McDonogh School. The 10-2 Gaels, ranked previously 3rd in the Baltimore Sun poll, avenged a regular season loss to 2nd ranked McDonogh, after beating Calvert Hall 35-0 in the semifinals. The Gales' last MIAA A Conference title came in 2007.

Holzer came to Mt. St. Joseph in 2015 from Meade High School in Anne Arundel County, where he led the Bulldogs to a two region titles in four years at Meade and a 33-13 record. Holzer has distinguished himself as a leader who and a person who believes that Mt. St. Joseph's football gives him the chance "... to build a program where we're consistently good every year, just like Meade..." and take advantage of the opportunity "to test your coaching ability against some of the best athletes, not only in the area but in the state and in the country, and some of the best coaches. If you're really competitive and like what you do, I think you always want to test yourself."
