#### Scott Garceau

Part of the Baltimore sports landscape since 1980, Scott has been honored seven times as the State Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscaster and Sportswriters Association. The original voice of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens radio network, Scott and former Baltimore Colts legend Tom Matte broadcast the team's first 10 years, including Super Bowl XXXV win over the New York Giants. Scott is the former Sports Director at WMAR-2 TV and hosted the popular "Scott and Jeremy Show" on 1057 FM The Fan. Scott returned to the Orioles broadcast booth in 2020, providing play by play coverage of the home team, a role he previously filled for 13 years.

A member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Board of Selectors, Scott is one of 48 individuals who meet over Super Bowl weekend to select the Hall of Fame inductees each year.



#### Jamie Costello

Baltimore native Jamie Costello grew up in Rosedale and joined WMAR2 News in May, 1987. Jamie currently co-anchors the 5, 6 and 11pm news on Channel 2 and is active in the community serving as emcee for various charities and organizations. He is a rabid Orioles and Ravens fan, and has participated in the Scholar Athlete Awards event for over 10 years.

Jamie has two grown children and currently lives in Annapolis with his wife, Cheryl, and their son Giovanni and dog CoCo.

# Ben Eaton, Sr. Championship Awards

Numerous area public high school programs enjoyed noteworthy success during the 2022 football season. Twelve of the twenty-four teams in the Maryland State public school semifinals came from the Greater Baltimore Chapter and four chapter teams faced off in four of the six state championship games at Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis, yielding 2A/1A and 2A titles.

For these achievements, the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation will present Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Awards to these schools. The awards were renamed in 2008 to honor the memory of the legendary Dunbar High School coach who died suddenly prior to the 2007 season. Recognized by his peers and the community, Coach Eaton set a standard for performance and conduct that inspires coaches to embrace their roles as counselor, mentor, leader and friend.

## Dunbar Poets

The Dunbar Poets of Baltimore City earned back to back state championships with its 22-13 win over Patuxent High School on December 3, 2022 at Navy Marine Corps Stadium. The Class 2A/1A winners capped a 13-0 season and finished the year as The Baltimore Sun's #3 ranked team for the 2022 season. This was also the Poet's second consecutive undefeated season, with an offense that generated 7,440 total yards and averaged 46 points per game. The Poets dominated their opponents in the state playoffs, scoring 180 points, while allowing 20.



Dunbar was led by first team All-Metro RB Tristen Kenan, who ran for 1,928 yards and 22 TD's and last year's Offensive Player of the Year Devin Roche, who totaled 2,586 yards and 31 TD's as a multi-purpose QB/RB. The first team All Metro roster also included senior OL Ebubedike Nnabugwu and senior DB Tony Hart III, who registered 73 tackles for the season.

The Poets rallied from a 13-0 deficit in the first quarter to take a 14-13 lead at the half as QB Roche connected on a 38 yard TD pass with no time left on the clock. Dunbar held Patuxent to three first downs in the second half and grabbed four interceptions. DL Josh Fedd also contributed three sacks in the half to secure the win.

Head Coach Lawrence Smith earned his 8th state championship at Dunbar, only the third coach in Maryland public high school football history to win so many titles. His 169-24 record includes 49 playoff wins, the most of any high school head football coach.

## Milford Mill Millers

The Millers of Milford Mill Academy, coached by alumnus Reggie White, went undefeated winning the class 2A MPSSAA state championship. Milford Mill defeated Kent Island 25-16 after trailing 10-7 at the half at Navy Marine Corps Stadium in Annapolis on December 2, 2022. It was the Baltimore County school's second consecutive trip to the state finals and third since 2017.



Telling his players at the beginning of the season that they had some "unfinished business" to take care of after the heart-breaking 29-14 loss in last year's state finals, Coach White finished his 20th year with a 172-74 record. The 14-0 Millers won their second state title, their first coming back in 1987 when White was a player during that 13-0 season.

Milford Mill enjoyed a tremendous year, outscoring its opponents 635-111 and racking up 5,794 yards in total offense on its way to the championship. The Millers were led by All-Metro Offensive Player of the Year Sean Williams Jr., who rushed for 2,059 yards and 37 touchdowns during the 14-0 season, and junior quarterback Deshawn Purdie, a second team All-Metro selection, who was 13/20 for 138 yards passing, throwing for one TD and running for another in the final game. Coby Jones' 20-yard interception return for a touchdown with 4:45 left iced the game for the Millers.

The Millers were also led by All-Metro first team OL Rashard Herring and Emmanuel Gee, a senior DL who had 62 tackles, 26 for losses and 12 sacks during the 2022 campaign and second team All-Metro senior WR Daysen Shell.

## A. Paul Menton Award

---

The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annually presents the A. Paul Menton Award to the top ranked Baltimore area football team. The award is named in honor of the late A. Paul Menton, the longtime sports editor for *The Baltimore Evening Sun*. Mr. Menton also served as the commissioner of game officials and was a founding member of the Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation.



### St. Frances Academy

This year's award goes to the St. Frances Academy Panthers. Playing a national schedule that included one local contest with Arundel High School (which St. Frances won 50-0), the Panthers finished the year with a 9-1 record and ranked in the top 10 teams in the country. The team averaged 29 points per game while allowing only 11 points per game.

The Panthers were led by All-Metro Defensive Player of the Year Da'Shawn Womack, an LSU commit who is a 6'4", 240 lb. DL who totaled 42 tackles with 26 tackles for a loss, 15 sacks, caused 5 fumbles and returned 1 fumble for a TD. Other first team All-Metro players include junior QB Michael Van Buren, senior WR Ryan Manning, senior OL Alec Washington, senior DL Sam Greene, junior LB Simeon Coleman and senior DL Isaiah Neal.

Second team All-Metro players included senior OL PJ Wilkens, senior DL Brian Simms, junior DB Edrees Farooq, senior DB Kameron Howard and junior DB Ify Obidegwu.

Head Coach Messay Hailemariam concluded his 11th season at St. Frances and was the 2022 National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches High School Coach of the Year. Hailemariam was also named the Baltimore Ravens Coach of the Week during the first week of the 2022 season.

# Herb Armstrong Service to Football Award

The Award is not an annual award, but rather is given to deserving individuals who have made a significant personal contribution and commitment to football in the chapter area. ## Bruce Cunningham

Bruce Cunningham, the long time sports director and weekday sports anchor on WBFF/Fox 45, retired from the station in March 2022 after a 31-year run on Baltimore television. He was one of the biggest promoters of amateur high school football in town. Bruce continues to appear on his weekend slot on 105.7 The Fan as an enthusiastic commentator, reporter and fan of Baltimore sports.

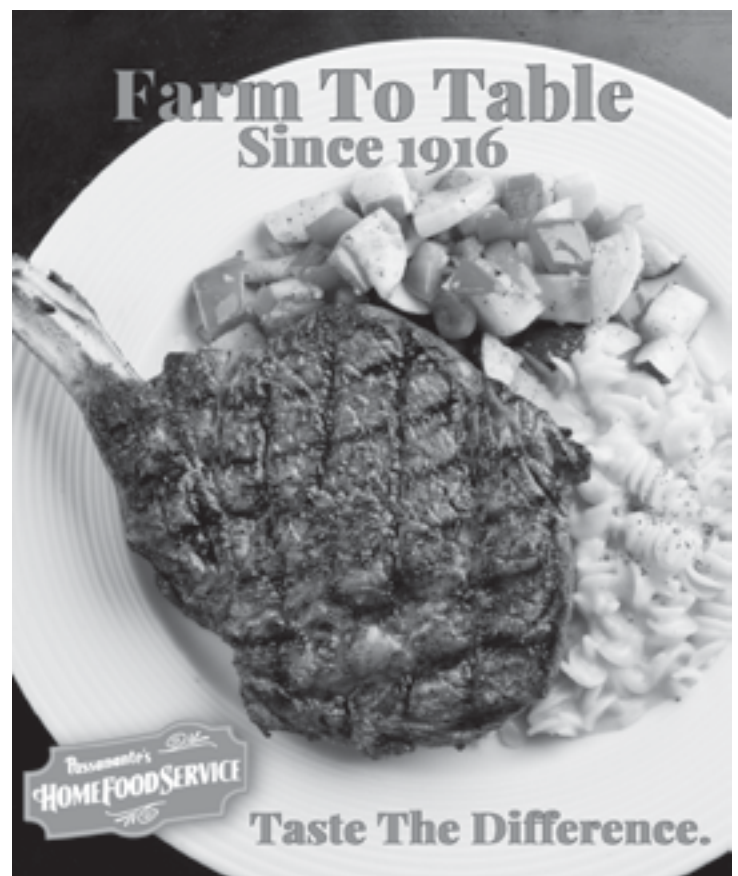


Bruce arrived here in 1991 from Alabama, joining a brand-new newcast at WBFF-TV. He was the last remaining on-air talent from the original WBFF-TV broadcast team before his retirement. Bruce created the weekly “Prep Athlete of the Week” award and has always recognized the huge impact of the award on the players, their programs and the sports’ profile with colleges looking for athletes to recruit. Bruce’s *Sports Unlimited* Sunday broadcast at 10:30 p.m. became a weekly staple of Baltimore sports news for amateur and professional sports fans throughout the region.

Bruce’s 45-year career in broadcasting began in college as an 18-year old VCU student working at the local television station, WXEX-TV. Bruce’s career includes time as the play-by-play announcer for the Baltimore Stallions of the Canadian Football League and the first play-by-play announcer for the newly arrived Baltimore Ravens. Bruce also worked as the Ravens public address announcer for 20 years, stepping down

in 2019. Bruce was named the Maryland Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sports Media Association in 2022 and has been recognized by many of his peers for his mentorship and leadership within the broadcasting community. Bruce’s other awards include the AP Best Sports Features award in 1992, 1993 and 1994, the AP Best Year-Round Sports Coverage Awards in 1991, 1992, 1997-2001 and 2003-2014 and the Pimlico Old Hilltop Award in 2004.

Bruce and his wife Wendy live in Pasadena and are enjoying spending more time with their children and grandchildren.

Football has become the emotionally integrating force of the American school and college and, to no small degree, a unique training ground for leadership in our competitive society. The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame is a nationwide organization whose purposes include: the promotion of our American football game as an integral and vital part of our education processes; the encouragement of playing the game at all levels of competition – on the sandlots, in junior and senior high schools, and in colleges; and the establishment of the proper incentives and ideals for American youth consistent with high standards of sportsmanship among players. The College Football Hall of Fame honors those men who have excelled on the college playing field and contributed to society.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter is one of 120 chapters organized in the football centers of our nation. The Chapter held its first formal organized meeting on June 28, 1961. Through the efforts of such founders as Dr. George “Tank” McLaren, Harry Lawrence, John Donohue, Charley Havens, Dave Kaufman, Paul Menton, Don Kellet, Charles P. McCormick, Sr., and the Chapter’s first president, Howard “Dutch” Eyth, the foundation for the organization was formed.

Primary among its efforts, the Baltimore Chapter sponsors the annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, which recognizes a scholar-athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in Baltimore City and the counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard and those who have made lifetime contributions to high school or college football. The first dinner was held in 1964 at the then Sheraton Belvedere Hotel under the chairmanship of Dr. R.D. “Bo” Menton, Jr. Through the years, more than 3,775 Scholar-Athletes have been honored and over 55,000 people have attended the dinner.

Scholarships awarded have amounted to more than \$505,000. Over 500 people will attend tonight’s dinner where we will honor 70 outstanding young men. The budget for this year’s affair exceeds \$50,000, in contrast to the original year’s budget of \$3,500. The Chapter takes great pride in its dinner, which is the largest of more than 100 similar events held by Foundation chapters throughout the country. Our dinner is the only one that honors a Scholar-Athlete from each of the football-playing high schools in its chapter region.

The Chapter is also a supporter of the Baltimore Touchdown Club.

# 2023 Scholar Athletes

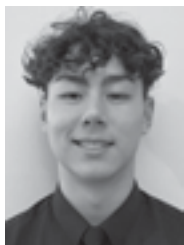

6-0, 204, QB/LB/P/K

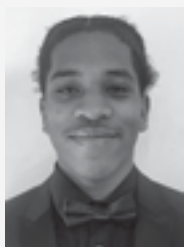
