60th ANNUAL SCHOLAR ATHLETE AWARDS DINNER TO BE HELD AT MARTIN'S WEST ON MARCH 20, 2024 at 6:00 p.m.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame will hold in-person the 61st Annual Scholar Athlete Awards Dinner, starting at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 20, 2024 at Martin's West in Woodlawn, Baltimore County, Maryland. The dinner will honor 77 football scholar athletes from the Greater Baltimore area including Baltimore City, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Harford, and Howard counties (list attached). Five regional scholarship winners will be selected and will share \$20,000 in scholarship money. Nationally recognized as the largest and best of its kind in the country, the dinner will also honor the top area scholastic and college football teams.

The Greater Baltimore Chapter will present the Ben Eaton Sr. Championship Award, named in honor of the legacy of the former Dunbar football coach, to the Maryland Class 1A/2A champion Dunbar High School Poets and the Class 3A/4A champion Mergenthaler Vo-Tech High School of Baltimore City and the Class 3A champions Oakdale High School of Frederick County. The evening's program will also honor Archbishop Spalding High School with the A. Paul Menton Award, as the top-rated high school program in the Baltimore area and one of the top scholastic programs in the United States. The chapter will also honor Chip Kelly, the former Johns Hopkins University Assistant Football Coach with the James Margraff Coaches Award. Chip was recently hired as the Offensive Coordinator at The Ohio State University after successful stints as the Head Coach at UCLA and the University of Oregon.

Master of Ceremonies for the evening will be Scott Garceau, the longtime local tv and radio sports personality who is currently working as a play by play announcer for the Baltimore Orioles.
